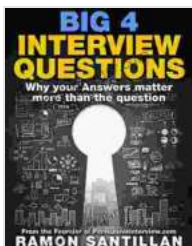


# Why the Answer Matters More Than the Question: Unlocking the Power of Critical Thinking

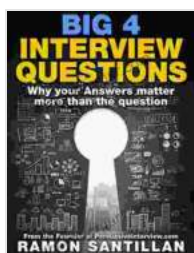
